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SAMPLE

- 660 training conscripts of the Hellenic Navy.
- Age ranges from 18 to 37 (Mn = 22.0, St. Dev. = 2.8). About 80 % are younger than 25 years old.
- 63.8 % live in big urban centers,
 25.6 % live in the country side.
- 8.0 % have received primary education only, 17.3 % secondary education,
 39.1 % technical/professional education, and 7.6 university education.
- 2.7 % are married.
- 7.6 % come from divorced families.
- Participants can all be considered as generally healthy. Conscripts go through medical screening before enlistment in the Service. Thus, men suffering from serious physical or mental conditions are deferred or discharged.

MEASURES

- A. A questionnaire measuring alcohol use (frequency and quantity) for adolescents (Madianos et al, 1994).
- B. A questionnaire measuring alcohol use (frequency and quantity) for adults (Madianos et al, 1994).
- C. A questionnaire assessing psychosocial complications related to alcohol use (Madianos et al, 1994).
- D. The Cage test that traces hidden alcoholism (Ewing and Rouse, 1970; Mayfield et al, 1974).
- E. The Suicide Risk Scale (SR-S) (Plutchik et al, 1989).

Demographic information about the participants were also taken.

PROCEDURE

- Collection of data took place in the Training Campus of the Hellenic Navy in the island of Poros during the second and third week of training.
- Groups of 20 30 completed the questionnaires in the presence of one civilian psychiatrist and two conscript psychologists who gave the instructions. Training officers were not present.
- The conscripts answered voluntarily after they were informed about the general purpose of the study.

RESULTS FOR PROBLEMATIC DRINKING

1. Frequency of Problematic Drinking by Means of Adolescent Criteria

I.e. participants scoring 1 or higher in the Adolescents' Frequency/Quantity questionnaire <u>plus</u> scoring 1 or higher in the Psychosocial variables questionnaire.


RESULTS FOR HIDDEN ALCOHOLISM


PSYCHOSOCIAL COMPLICATIONS RELATED TO HIDDEN ALCOHOLISM

- Psychosocial complications score is found to have a positive correlation with score in the Cage Test (Pearson's r = 0.35, p<0.01).
- Participants who are found positive in hidden alcoholism give significantly more positive responses in 7 out of the 8 items of the psychosocial complications questionnaire.
